

TAKING ONLINE PRACTICE TESTS


The online practice tests in *Testing & Education Reference Center* assess your skills and knowledge in preparation for exams. Each test offers two or three online practice exams with scoring for multiple choice sections, and sample answers for short answer and essay segments.

Select any exam to find the online practice tests. The practice test will open in a new tab or window. Each section of the test is available for practice. Simply click **Start** to begin.

The test will provide one question at a time. Click **Next** to move to the next question. Use the **Jump to question** drop box to move to different questions. This is useful to review answers.

To exit the test, you can:

- **Score** the exam and exit. There is no way to reset your exam, so make sure you are finished before scoring.
- **Save** the answers you have provided so far and exit the exam. This is useful when you don't have time to finish the exam and want to pick up where you left off later.
- **Cancel** any answers you've given so far and exit the exam. This is useful if you want to start fresh at another time.



REVIEWING ONLINE PRACTICE EXAMS

Once you **Score** an exam, you can click to **Review** your answers. Click **Correct/Incorrect** links to view answers. Each question provides your answer and an explanation of the correct response to help you master concepts and strategies you will need during exams. You can move through the test by using the **Jump to question** drop box, or the **Previous** and **Next** buttons to review the entire test.
